



MAKE MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS

Make musical instruments at home for a marching band.

This week's activities: Flute - Rain Stick - Tambourine

Flute

Suggested Materials:

- 8 jumbo straws
- Tape
- String
- Scissors
- Marker
- Stickers

Directions:

- 1. Place the straws together in a line and tape securely on both sides.
- 2. Using a ruler and sharpie, draw a diagonal line across the straws and cut the ends.
- 3. Decorate with stickers and attach a string using tape if you like.

Rain Stick

Suggested Materials:

- 1 empty paper towel roll
- Duct tape and clear tape
- 1/4 cup of dry rice or beans
- White paper
- Paint
- Sticker or glitter



Directions:

- 1. Duct tape the paper towel roll at one end and pour in about ¼ cup of dry rice or beans into the tube.
- 2. Duct tape the other end shut.
- 3. Cover the entire roll except for the ends with a sheet of letter size paper. Secure with tape.
- 4. Decorate using coloured paper, paint, stickers or string. Enjoy the relaxing sounds of your rain stick.

Tambourine

Suggested Materials:


- 2 paper plates
- One-hole punch
- String
- Dry rice or beans
- Markers, stickers or paint
- Scissors


Directions:

- Start by decorating the back side of both paper plates.
- 2. Using the one-hole punch, make holes around the rim of one paper plate.
- 3. Lay the plate with the holes on top of the other plate and mark a dot on each of the holes. Using the one-hole puncher, punch out the rest of the holes on the other plate.
- 4. Lay one of the plates flat and pour in two tablespoons of dry rice or beans.
- 5. Laying the other plate on top, match up the holes and begin cutting 7-inch pieces of string.
- 6. Lastly, double knot a piece of string through each hole to secure both plates together and curl the ends of the string using the edge of the scissors.
